A MINING CAMP STRIKE.

Riches Develop in a Gulch Thought to Be Barren,

the little village of Grub Gulch, Madera county. The vein is from sixteen to eighteen inches in width. The shaft is down in it nearly thirty feet and the gold, bearing ore taken out already is very rich.
