THE FALL OF PARIS. The Extensive Preparations Now Being Made for the Opening. The signs are in the air! The ring of the hammer and ceaseless buzz of the saw heard on the bluff are sure indications that the initial steps in the great fall display have been taken. The illuminated pictures of Emperor William and his staff, now exhibited at all convenient points throughout the city and country announce that October 1 will witness the formal opening of the open air spectacles. The proprietors, Messrs. Leubrie & Galoway, and the gentlemen associated with them, have been tireless in their efforts and the richest results await their labor. These two gentlemen are just home from New York, where contracts were closed for uniforms, fireworks and other accessories necessary in producing the "Fall of Paris" with the most complete effects. The artist is busy on the scenic effects, and his enthusiasm over the subject is a guarantee that the work will be well done. An appeal man was fortunate enough to gain some inside pointers as to the extensive preparations which are being made and which show the people that this is an enterprise of no little moment. The immense stage now building will be 400 feet long and 250 deep, requiring not less than 27,000 feet of lumber. When the stage setting is in place the scenery will comprise 2,700 feet of artistic work done at an enormous cost. The large fence surrounding the grounds and the grand stand will require 80,000 feet of lumber. All of these details will give some idea of the magnitude of the work undertaken. Over 600 people will take part in the drama, the action of which is spirited and striking. The costumes ordered for the imperial staff are handsome in design and material, and the wearers will be proud to be seen arrayed therein. It has been almost decided that the principal actors will be selected for their resemblance to the imperial commanders. All the committees have been appointed, and are now arranging all the details for the opening night. The members of the Sphinx, with marked generosity propose to donate the fifteen floats in the late carnival to any committee who will undertake to organize a trade procession on the opening of the display. This is a fine opportunity to utilize ready made material and show an industrial exhibit which will have the thousands of visitors that we are not behind in that line. The offer should be taken advantage of at once, and steps taken in the right direction. The libretto, of which advance sheets have been furnished THE APPEAL, furnishes a spirited history of the inception and progress of the Franco-German war. It is as concise as was possible to make it and maintain the salient points of so important an era. It is the authorship of the general secretary, Lou Leubrie, and reflects great credit on his historical accuracy and gift of vivid expression.
