Cass occurred the happy thought of seizing for Limself the middle ground. "A change" began to seal over the "spirit of his dream." A period, however, of several months was necessary to clear the mist from the eyes of this auxious inquirer. But by the 25th of Desee, Miss Eliza Hughes, Miss Eli cember of the same year, in that concerted extempore, the Nicholson letter, we find this "open and accord oppo-nent" of any plan or doctrine" which would exclude Congress, and restricting it merely to "the creation of proper governments for new countries acquired or settled and to the necessary provisions for their eventual admis sion into the Union, leaving IN THE MEANTIME, to the people inhabiting them, to regulate their interna concerns in their own way - he strikes a balance again. by putting to the Northern credit side, the dogma of the Mississouri Restriction in its most odious form: "I speak here (says he) of the inherent power of Congress, and by an express disclaimer. Speaking of the probability that a treaty with the slavery restriction would be rejected by Southern Senators, he declares that "such a treaty would be rejected just as certainly as presented to the Senate.—More than one-third of that body would vote against it, viewing such a principle as an exclusion of the citizens of the slaveholding States from a participation in the benefits acquired by the treasure and exertions of all; and which should be common to all. -I am repeating — neither advancing nor defeading these views.
