

CITY ITEMS.

SEVERAL RAILROAD ACCIDENTS—A profound gloom was cast over this community, Saturday afternoon, by the report, seemingly authentic, that a collision of trains had occurred on the Orange and Alexandria railroad, Friday evening, leaving the death of one of the Southern Railway volunteers, who left this city for Manassas Junction, Friday night. Great anxiety was manifested yesterday, to obtain reliable information as to the cause of the accident, and much relief was afforded by the receipt of intelligence that the reported loss of life had been exaggerated. As far as we have been able to ascertain the fact, it appears that the collision of the Orange and Alexandria trains, which occurred on the Orange and Alexandria railroad, Friday night, was a serious one, and that the collision occurred on a side track used by the down passenger train. The military train being a very long one, occupied the main track, and as the down train passed at a rapid rate of speed, the locomotive struck the projecting car, and killed two of the occupants, whose names, as reported to us by Dr. J. H. McCall, were, one, a private, and the other, a private first class, both of whom were members of Colonel Kirk's regiment; others that they belonged to a Virginia company. Several others in the car were injured, but not fatally.
