Reports from places which used voting machines in the recent State elections show the superiority of the machine over the lead-pencil-and-ballot method. In no place where the machines were used were returns later than one-half hour after the closing of the polls. In most places where the old-fashioned way of voting prevailed there was seldom a complete and accurate return within twenty-four hours. Machines are now in use in more than 600 cities, towns and villages in the United States. Buffalo, Syracuse, San Francisco, Indianapolis, Milwaukee, Cleveland and Omaha are among the larger cities where they have been adopted.

The latest distribution of Carnegie Hero Fund medals bestowed a deserved recognition upon sixteen persons who have distinguished themselves by deeds of courage which resulted in the saving of life. It is interesting to note that, of the sixteen, ten live in or near Chicago. As in previous lists, the latest beneficiaries include many young people, nearly all of whom received grants of money in with which to complete their education. The details of the deeds for which the awards were made are inspiring reading, especially for that growing number of intelligent persons who realize that war is not necessary to breed heroism.

Happily the horse has a faculty for upsetting the gloomy predictions that he is fated to be put out of business by the automobile.
