Afternoon Dispatches.

New York, Jan. 1.

Publishers of all classes—especially that in the subscription business—report a noticeable revival of the book trade during the holidays. A new demand has sprung up for Greeley's American Conflict. Of Brown's Great Metropolis, just out, twenty thousand copies have been ordered. Kane's Arctic Expedition is selling immensely, and other books in proportion. The demand for the West and South is particularly active.

A City of Mexico letter states that Minister Roccrans was formally received by President Juarez on the 11th inst.

A London dispatch states that the owner of the English yacht Cambria declines the racing challenge of Mr. Bennett, of the New York Yacht Club, to race with the Dauntless, as the latter is of much heavier tonnage than the Cambria.

A Port au Prince letter states that the English and French fleet threatened to lay the town of Gonaives in ashes unless the schooner De Hart was released from illegal seizure. She was released.

A movement favorable to the annexation of Cuba to Mexico is said to be in progress in Mexico. Meetings have been held favoring the project.

At a meeting of artists last Thursday, a resolution was adopted to unite painters, sculptors, and all having an interest in the fine arts, in a movement to consider the proper steps to be taken by them to secure such amendments and alterations to existing laws as shall afford full protection to art.

The agent of the Virginia Express Company was knocked down and robbed of \$12,000 at about five o'clock Thursday morning, while on his way to the depot. The agent was seriously injured.

The daughter of Alson, the prisoner who escaped the gallows by suicide, only fifteen years of age, is under arrest in New Jersey City, on a charge of murdering her illegitimate offspring, Thursday.

John W. Mix is under arrest in Newark, N. J., on suspicion of having fired Win Titus' bakery, last Saturday.

A London letter says the late meeting of the society for the Prohibition of the Game, was the scene of a disgraceful personal collision. The particular question in debate was the granting of two thousand pounds to be expended at Natal. One party wanted Bishop Colenso and his supporters to have the money, and the other wanted it to go to the rival Bishop.
