Avoid chilling the body by sitting or standing in a cool place after the bath.

Avoid remaining too long in the water, Leave the bath immediately if there is the slightest feeling of chilliness.

The vigorous and strong may bathe early in the morning before taking breakfast, but the young and the weak had better bathe two of three hours after a meal.

Those who are subject to attacks of giddiness or faintness and those who suffer from palpitation and other sense of discomfort should bathe in tepid water only three or four times a week.
