"COPS" SAY DRUNK; SUPERIOR COURT

Can a Man Sober Up in
Less Than Four Hours,
Is Point Involved.

DETROIT, Aug. 23.—Just what condition a man must be in to constitute intoxication was the subject of discussion between Police Justice Jeffries and Patrolman Henry Jacques in the police court. The court finally decided he knew more about the condition of the three prisoners before him than the patrolman and straightway discharged them.

The officer arrested John McDonald, William Sugden, and Jeremiah Doherty at 6:30 p. m., charging them with being drunk. They were "shooting the can" and making a general nuisance of themselves in an alley off Michigan avenue, between Fourth and Fifth streets, of the court testified.

"Are you sure they were drunk?" the court queried.

"Yes, your honor, they were staggering around," Officer Jacques answered.

"They belong to a gang that we are trying to break up. For some time we have been receiving complaints—

"Now, none of that," the court interrupted. "I don't want to know anything about that; I just want to know whether these men were drunk in the afternoon. They were at my residence at 10 o'clock at night, and they were not drunk then."

"Well, they were drunk when I arrested them," Jacques insisted. "And I have Patrolman Ben Brazil to testify the same as I have done."

Brazil corroborated Jacques' testimony, but in spite of the evidence of both men, the court held that they were sober.

In addition to his evidence, Jacques brought along the can from which the boys were said to have been drinking beer.
