11 FIREMEN HURT; NONE FATALLY HEROIC RESCUE WORK AT SEVENTH STREET FIRE SAVES LIVES

5 CAUGHT IN COLLAPSE OF BURNING BUILDING; BURIED THREE HOURS

Comrades Dig Them Out. Injured Men Are Resting Comfortably—American Five and Ten Cent Store Guttered By Flames—Loss Placed At \$60,000.

Buried for nearly three hours beneath tons of burning debris, five members of No. 6 engine company narrowly escaped death early today while fighting a stubborn fire in American Five and 10-cent store, 314-16 Seventh street. The men were working on the main floor when, without warning, the three upper floors of the building collapsed. That they were not killed was a miracle.
