TO PROTECT NEGROES.

Federal Department of Justice About to Open Fight For Southern Negroes Before , Supreme Court -Arises Out of Arkansas Affair.

Arises Out of Arkansas Affair.

Washington, D. C.—(Special.)—Roosevelt's Department of Justice is about to fight a battle for the negroes of the South before the Supreme-court of the United States that the administration hopes will bedim the recollection of the Brownsville affair. Attorney General Bonaparte has buckled on his sword, and the skirmish is now on.

The case arises out of an alleged attempt of white men of Arkansas to frighten negros who were working for the Arkansas Lumber Company, away from their jobs. Notices were posted warning the negroes from continuing at work. In this connection, a half dozen white men were convicted of violating the federal statute, ensoted just after the adoption of the thirteenth amendment to the constitution, which makes it an offense to conspire to threaten or intimidate any citizen in the free exercise of his rights. A little more than a year ago, the Supreme court liberated, in another case, certain men who had been convicted of a similar offense.

With this situation, and, it is understood, upon orders from the president, the attorney general, unwilling to entrust the task to a subordinate, himself has prepared to plead the cause of the colored men. In addition to his brief, already filed with the Supreme courl. Bonapart is expected to argue the case orally before the court when it comes up in about ten days for hearing.

"To be free is to be wholly free," says Bonaparte in his brief. "It does not mean that a man may merely have his personal liberties and at the same time be hedged about by prohibitions and restrictions and denied first one right and then snother that belongs to free men. He can not have his full constitutional right unless he is in no sense whatever in involuntary servitude, and he may claim the protection of Federal law, if enacted by

in involuntary servinde, and he may claim the protection of Federal law, if enacted by Congrass, against the first infringement of his freedom, without waiting until he is stripped of sill his rights and forced into a condition of shoulde and abject slavery.

"The government contends that the right of a colored man to dispose of his own service, to pursue any legitimate occupation or employment, is a right secured to him by the thirteenth amendment to the constitution, and that to deprive him of the enjoyment of that right is, to enforce upon him one of the inseparable and necessary invidents or badges of slavery. If individuals can combine to hinder the negro because of his race, in the pursuit of employment, they can, by persistent, progressive acts, at last deprive him of every right, the free enjoyment of which is necessary to keep him from returning into practical bondage."
