3. All electors registered up to January 1, 1898, are made life electors, and enrolled as such in a · record filed in the office of the clork of the Court or in the office of the Secretary of State, subject to disqualification by future crimes.

4. After January 1, 1898, no one can register and become a voter and has paid taxes on property of the assessed value of three hundred dollars.
