PURSUANT to authority delegated by following resolution, adopted by City Council March 26, 1872, I will sell at public auction, on WEDNESDAY, May 15, 1872, TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000) DOLLARS City of Columbia seven per cent. twenty year bonds.

"Resolved, That the City Treasurer be instructed to advertise for sale before the Court House, in the city of Columbia, on the 15th day of May next, the bonds of the city of Columbia authorized to be issued by the said city, under the Act of the General Assembly published in our newspaper in the city of Columbia, one in the city of Charleston, and two newspapers in the city of New York, at least thirty days before the day of sale; that the bonds to be sold be signed as prescribed by the said Act, on the day of sale, or as soon thereafter as practicable, and delivered to the purchaser as aforesaid; that the proceeds of the sale of the bonds be applied strictly in conformity with the said Act, and in no other way."

Said bonds will be of the denominations of \$20, \$50 and \$100. The proceeds of the sale to be used for the erection of new City Hall, new Market and other public improvements.
