In the touching and fervent peroration of his masterly Ku Klux speech, Mr. Bayard took occasion to refer to the ignoble charges of Senator Pratt, that the rebels gloried in their "crime," honored those who fought, and paid to the graves of those who fell the tribute of saored tears and grateful flowers.

"Yes, Mr. President," said the man whom Delaware is proud to have given to an appreciative country, "yes, Mr. President, should it ever come to pass that the graves of the Southern dead should be neglected by their kindred, kind nature herself will take their place, and the Southern earth in which the dead sleep, will yield its lilies and its daisies to wreath their places of rest, and the soft winds of the South will gently wave the grass above them, and gently wave the grass above them, and the dews of her starry nights will keep grass and flowers fresh in memory of her brave children who died in defence of the soil which now contains them."

This is true eloquence, softer and less clariontoned, as becomes its more sub-dued theme, but as true eloquence as Demosthenes' mighty protest and adjur-ation by the souls of those who died at Marathon and Salamis.

Dr. Mary Walker was made very much enraged on Wednesday, because the United States Commissioner of Patents would not permit her to place the military costume she accounted herself in during the war, in the glass cabinet con-Lincoln. The clothes were labeled, "Worn by Mrs. Dr. Mary Walker during the war," and as an historic relic for the inspection of future generations, would have been invaluable.

In spite of the labors of office-holders, in spite of the drilled negro vote, and in spite of all the influence of the Administration and the power of large sums of money sent from New York, there is good reason to hope for a Conservative victory in North Carolina in August, and an overwhelming triumph for Gree-ley and Brown in November.






