Dr. S. B. Thral, of Ottumwa, read a report on *Typus Malarial Fever*, which was discussed by Dr. J. W. Smith, Carpenter, Hinesy, Angier, Caldwell, Schultz, Gustine, Thral, and was finally referred to the Committee on Publication.

Thirty members were in attendance at the opening session, and a large number of applications were made for admission to membership.
