JENNINGS NOMINATED.

Jacksonville, June 23.—After a long and heated session, last night, Hon. W. S. Jennings of Hernando, received the nomination for governor. His nomination was made unanimous.

Platform

Chairman Robert McNamee of Lake read the report of the committee on platform. As it would fill three columns of the Star, we give the gist of the 36 paragraphs:

National Questions

- 1. Declaration of principles. 2. Indorse Chicago platform.
- 3. Indorse Bryan and his cause since adoption of Chicago platform.
- 4. Extol Bryan as a model patriot and great leader and his work since President McKinley refused to send him to the front during the Spanish war, and instruct Florida delegates to IN THE WORLD vote for him for presidential nominee.
- 5. Denounce republican legislation That will pull the thermometer in maintaining a large standing army as subversive of the principles of liberty and government set up in Porto


