

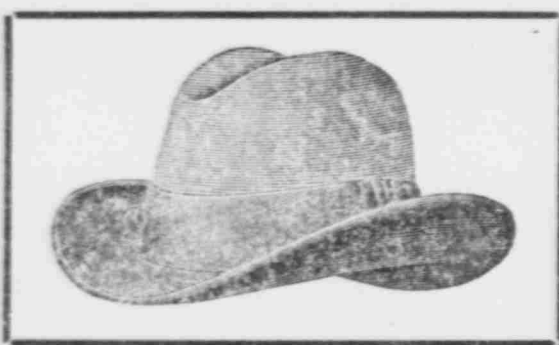

A LETTER FROM THE VESTRY OF GRACE EPISCOPAL CHURCH

To the Members of the Church:

To you, as one interested in the maintenance of the worship of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Ocala, we, the members of the vestry of Grace Church, desire to call your attention to what has been accomplished by the parish during the past year, in order that you may feel with us that our fondest hopes have been more than realized.

After the purchase of the lot on which the church now stands, anticipating the falling down of the old church by tearing it down was an expression of our faith in you. Could the little body of Christians that compose our congregation build a church? The church of which we are justly proud is the answer to that question.

The construction of church, improvement of property, etc., has cost us to date, \$2874.77. But to complete the church it was necessary for us to negotiate a loan of \$700. The amount of this loan has already been reduced by the taking up of two notes of a hundred each. To further reduce this loan and to meet certain obligations that rest upon the parish, you are asked to give this Easter. For your convenience in making Easter offering we inclose envelope. Place same in the alms basin or in the hands of Mr. George C. Pasteur, treasurer.

As the rector has said, if we all put on the altar on Easter that which is to us an offering unto the Lord, we need have no fear as to the result.
