### FORREST'S SON FELL

Stricken with Paralysis, While Watching a Play at a Memphis Theater

Memphis, Tenn., Feb. 5.—While watching a play in which his father, the late General Nathan Bedford Forrest, the famous Confederate cavalry leader, was portrayed as chief of a "Klu-Klux-Klan," Captain William Forrest, an ex-Confederate soldier, was the victim of a paralytic stroke last night at the Lyceum Theater. He was removed to his residence, where today physicians said he was in a critical condition. His sons in Washington and St. Louis have been summoned to his bedside.

That United Harry Thaw's Sister to the Earl of Yarmouth

London, Feb. 6.—Sir Birrel Barnes, president of the divorce court, yesterday granted the Countess of Yarmouth who was Miss Alice Thaw, of Pittsburg, a decree nullifying her marriage to the Earl of Yarmouth. The case was heard in private.

It has been well known for two years past that the domestic affairs of the Yarmouths were unhappy. The earl's companions and his manner of living, it was said, were such that he could not give his wife the place in society she had a right to expect. She supplied large sums of money to defray her husband's extravagances, and her friends say she has conducted herself with dignity throughout the troubles, resulting from this unhappy union, and the difficulties of her brother, Harry K. Thaw.

### CHUMMED WITH A CORPSE

Horrible Nerve Displayed by a Female Ogre in Leipsic, Germany

Berlin, Feb. 6.—More than usually gruesome is a murder story which comes from Leipsic. Paul Giegler was the proprietor of a book shop in the Gorchenstrasse, and with him lived, professionally as housekeeper and assistant, a young woman named Minna Doell. About the middle of November Giegler disappeared from view, but his housekeeper explained this by saying that he had gone to Italy on business. As he did not return inquiries became more pressing, and the young woman then made the mistake of altering her story, saying that Giegler was in a Vienna hospital.

This change of tale aroused suspicions, and when investigation in Vienna failed to reveal any traces of the missing man, a search at his house was decided on. Accordingly the police went to Giegler's house, whereupon the Doell girl jumped from a window and fled. Investigation showed that the bed, which was made and apparently unoccupied, contained the body of Giegler. The remains were black and in an advanced stage of decomposition. There were traces that death had been caused by suffocation. It was evident that the girl had cooked and slept in the same room with the dead man for weeks. She had made off with the sum of \$2,500, but was arrested at Halle. It was ascertained that she had a sweetheart, and he was also taken into custody on the suspicion that he had something to do with the crime.
