Paris, Feb. 26.—A little child has saved his mother and uncle as well as himself, from a terrible death by what appeared to him a simple remark. The frugal supper, consisting of soup and potatoes was being cooked, and on their return the little fellow told his mother in an undertone that she need not mix any salt with the potatoes, as the stranger had put some in the pot.

Soon they were seated at the table, discussing the soup, but when the visitor said he had enough after the potatoes were served, the uncle, who had overheard the boy's remark, became convinced that mischief had been at work. Taking up his gun, he pointed it at the stranger, and threatened to shoot him if he refused to touch the potatoes. The man was forced to comply, but hardly had he swallowed a few mouthfuls when he fell down dead. The peasant searched him and found a revolver, a knife and a whistle. He promptly blew the whistle, and figures approached, but he frightened them off when he fired in their direction.
