Mrs. Jeffcoat returned from Wildwood today.

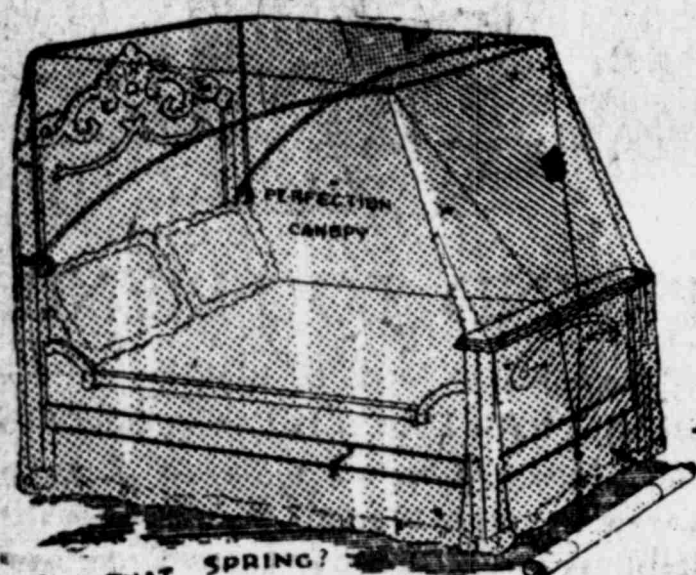
Miss Clara May Laird of Ocala is expected in Oxford soon.

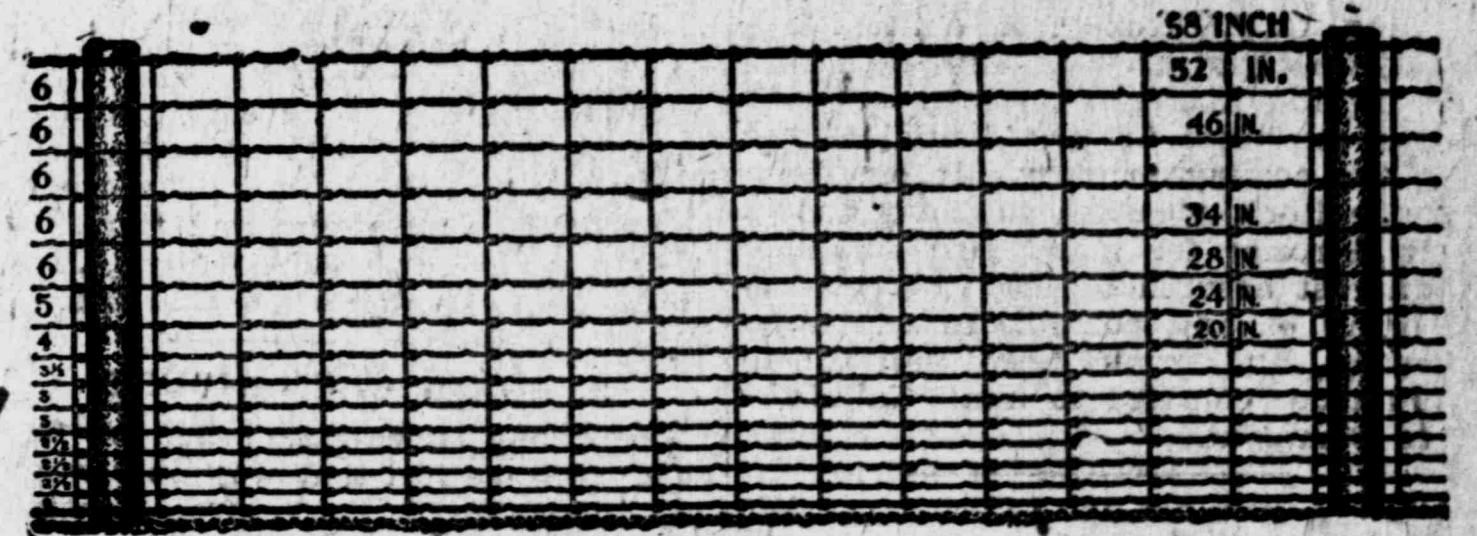

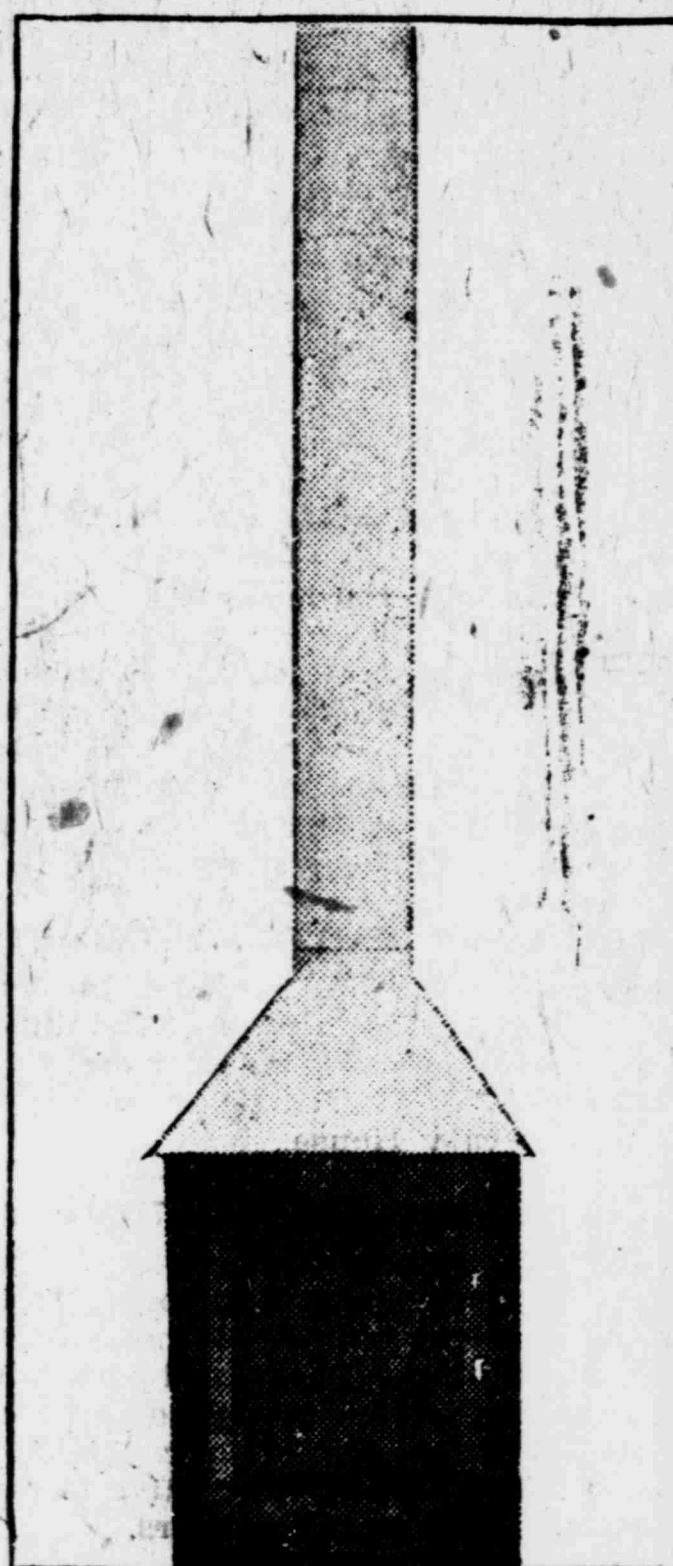
