Seven Men Killed and Thirty Wound ed by a Powder Explosion at Windsor, Misosuri

Windsor, Mo., Sept. 16.-Seven persons are dead and thirty injured, four of whom are not expected to live, as the result of an explosion of a car of black powder at the Missouri, Kansas & Texas station yesterday.

When it became known about town vesterday that a car of powder was on the tracks at the station a number of curiosity seekers, a majority of whom were negroes, assembled. A. F. Hershberger, a Missouri, Kansas & Texas freight conductor, became annoyed at their presence. In moving a keg of powder some of the explosive fell out. Seeing it on the ground, Hershberger remarked: "I'll show you how to scare negroes," He lighted a match and threw it into the powder.
