The mail matter received at the local postoffice was about the same as last year. Christmas day was the heaviest of the season, indicating that people are not mailing their packages as early as they should.

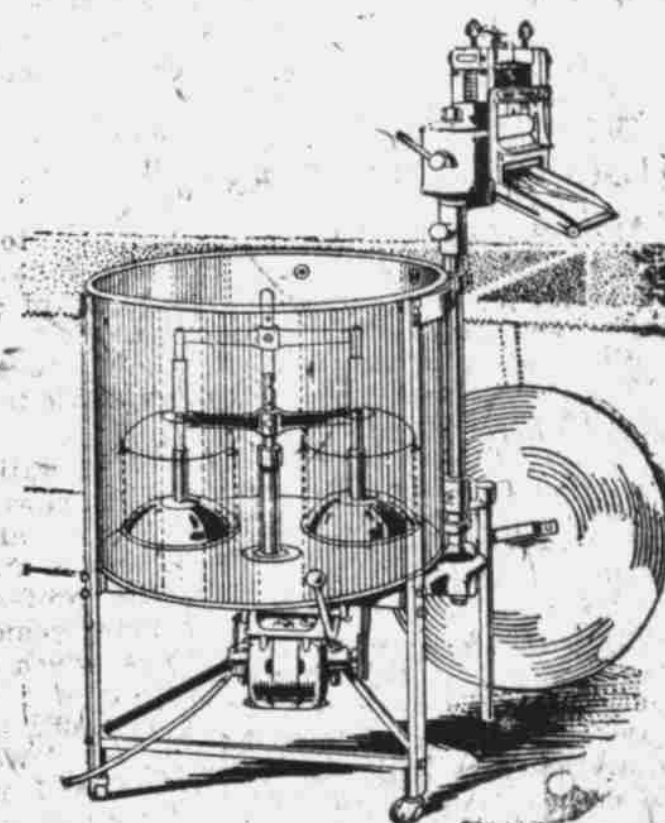
