Decoration of Graves in the Morning

---Address at Park---

Arrangements for Memorial day exercises were completed by the G. A. R. Friday night.

At 7:30 o'clock in the morning the G. A. R., Women's Relief corps, Ladies' Aid society, Sons of Veterans, Co. B, Eighth regiment, and Co. F, Tenth regiment, will assemble at the G. A. R. hall. They will march to Glendale cemetery, where the usual Memorial day exercises will take place. The graves of soldiers will be decorated.

The Eighth Regiment band will accompany the pupils of Kent school to the East Akron cemetery, where they will conduct exercises.

The band will then return to Glendale cemetery and furnish music.

In the afternoon at 1:30 o'clock the Eighth Regiment band and Buckley post, G.A.R., will march to Grace park. The exercises will consist of music by the band, prayer by Rev. L. A. Lindemuth, and an address by Judge J. R. Johnston, of Youngstown. Hon. Geo. W. Crouse will be president of the day. He will introduce Judge Johnston.

Should the weather be stormy the exercises will be held in the Grand Opera house.

SUNDAY THEATER.

Ministerial Alliance Informs Akron People of the Law.

The Ministerial Alliance has asked the DEMOCRAT to print the following section of the Revised Statutes of Ohio:

Section 7032a—(Exhibiting theatrical or dramatic performance on Sunday.)—Whoever on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, participates in or exhibits to the public with or without charge for admittance, in any building, room, ground, garden or other place in this state, any theatrical or dramatic performance of any kind or description, or any equestrian or circus performance of jugglers, acrobats, rope dancing, sparring exhibitions, variety shows, negro minstrelsy, living statuary, ballooning, or any base ball playing, or any ten pins or other games of similar kind or kinds, or participates in keeping any low or disorderly house or resort, or shall sell, dispose of, or give away any ale, beer, porter or spirituous liquors in any buildings adjacent or adjacent thereto, where any such show, performance or exhibition is given, or houses or places is kept, he or she shall, on complaint made within 25 days thereafter, be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, or be confined in the county jail not exceeding six months, or both, at the discretion of court. 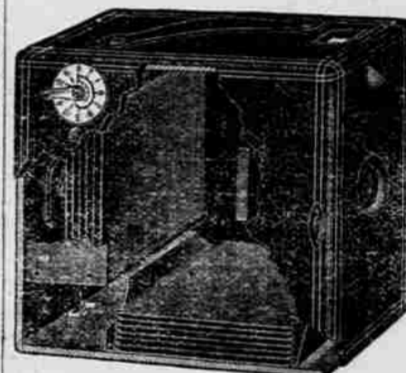

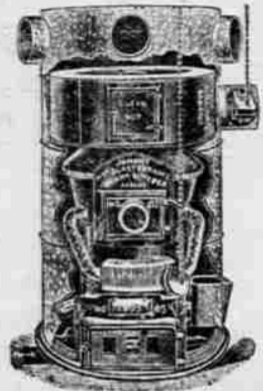

The Akron and A. B. & C. R. R. Systems.

The Northern Ohio Traction Company Organized—\$3,000,000 Capital.

At a meeting of the directors of the Akron Traction & Electric company and the Akron, Bedford & Cleveland Railroad company in Cleveland Friday the consolidation of the two systems was practically consummated.

The new corporation will be known as the Northern Ohio Traction company. It will be capitalized at \$3,000,000. A special meeting of stockholders is to be called in a few days to ratify the action taken by the directors.

The officers of the consolidated company will be, H. A. Everett, president; Will Christy, vice president; J. R. Nutt, treasurer; C. S. Moore, secretary, and L. S. Beilstein, general manager.

The new company will make many improvements and extensions. A line to Barberton is to be one of the first extensions.
