PRICES OF RANGE CATTLE

There is a disparity in prices of cattle sold on the range this senson. Young cattle sell at a few dollars less than beef cattle. The abundance of money seeking investment is the prime cause of high prices; but unless beef cattle advance within the next year or two, those people who invested this year will find their profits small. On this question of high prices the Kansas City Com-mercial Indicator says: The statements given in the Indicator from time to time, or the high prices which are being paid for cattle upon the ranges of the west, have tion is frequently asked, why such should be the case? It is an established fact that large amounts of money have been made within the past eight years by owners of large ranches in the New West, and that the profits have been large has caused the in vestment of vest sums of money, not only from the eastern portion of the United States but also from Europe. The demand for range cattle has, within the past year, ex-cessed the supply, and this has been one cause of the advance in prices.

But when we come to consider the imme diate cause of the advanced prices of cattle on the ranges of the New West, it is found that the last winter was the severest known for years, and if ever the losses of cattle, unprotected and allowed to shift for then solver, were to be large then should the losses have been heavy during the winter of 1880-81. But such has not been the case. The losses have been small, and this information has been conveyed to the capitalists of the East by owners of railroads, whose railroads traverse the cattle growing regions of the West, and this has stimulated a demand from that quarter. Ranchmen feel more encouraged this year than ever before, and they have good reason to feel so.

A NEW MEXICO SHEEP RANCH. ome idea of the extent of sheep raising in New Mexico may be inferred by the folrowing from the Red River Chronicle: G. W. Stonerood, of Cabra Springs, has the largest and best herd of fine Merino sheep in New Mexico. The flock, including ram and wethers, runs up to 22,000. This year's Ismbs will increase the herd by 9,500. The spring clip of wool aggregates nearly 120,-000 pounds, or a fraction over five pounds per head. This, at the present low price of wood even, will tetch not less than \$20,000; about a dollar per head. We will not misthe mark very far by asserting that this may be considered the income of the ranch for this year, as the sale of fine rums and mutton sheep will realize enough to defray the year's expenses of the estate. The Calira Springs ranch is the model sheep farm of New Mexico. Everything is carried on sys tematically, and gives satisfactory proof that theory and practice go hand in hand. Mr. Stoneroad is an old hand in the sheep business, having been engaged formerly in stock raising in California.

A new source of water supply in the vast desert mountain ranges of California and Arizona is worthy of note. No rain falls over a wide area. It is covered with cactus plants of every variety, and they are juicy. Millions of land tortoises feed on these plants, and the Indians make soup of them. Inside of each is an anatomical tank that holds about a pint of water. Many are cut open to get at this tank. The water is palatable. Thus meat and drink are supplied, and the dry cactus make excellent fuel. The law of compensation is here forcibly illuitrated.
