A Cure for Cattle Fever.

[Cor. Texas Live Stock Journal] WACO, TEXAS, June 1, 1883.-Mr. J. W. Mann of this place has some extra fine cattle. He shipped a ear load of fine calves from Tennessee a short time since; for awhile he had the same luck with them that usually befalls all fine cattle imported to this section. They were attacked with fever and costiveness and in a day or two after, he lost nine head and was in a fair way to loose the entire herd. men especially the free use of linseed oil; but to no purpose. He tried all remedies known to stockhe would try sweet milk and molasses. He mixed in proportion of two quarts of milk to one of molasses, giving each calf a quart of the mixture. It acted like a charm. In two hours time the bowels of every sick calf were moved, and in two day's time the herd was sound and healthy.

He states that his calves were burning up with fever and despite all he could do, before using the milk and molasses the bowels of the calves became completely locked and they died in two days from the time they were taken. Fencing.

The Glidden & Sanborn pasture in the Panhandle is one of the best in the state. It is constructed of four No. 11 steel galvanized wires, each wire having a strength of over twenty-five hundred pounds. The posts are twenty feet apart with a picket between. It cost \$300 per mile, complete. Probably the MILLINERY ROOMS. cost of a first-class fence would be no greater in any section of the state and where better facilities for transportation can be had the average cost would not be over \$250.00 per mile, and by dispensing with one wire and widening the distance between posts another material saving could be made, but at the sacrifice of permanent value. It is worth from \$20 to \$30 per mile to set material is on the ground.-Ft. Worth Journal.

New Kind of Grass.

The Medicine Lodge Cresset describes a new kind of grass: The range this season, especially on high ground, is covered with a peculiar kind of grass generally known as wild wheat. It grows from six to eight inches tall and has a bearded head, closely resembling a small head of wheat. In regard to the utility of this grass, stockmen seem to be divided in opinion. One stock man of long experience, gives it as his opinion that stock fatten rapidly on it. Another, of equal experience, informs us emphatically, that the grass is of no account, and has no more nutritive properties than so much foxtail grass. Upon one thing, however, all seem to agree, and that is, that cattle were never doing better than at Arrive at Tascosa on Mondays and Thurs present. During a conversation with a gentleman from Texas, a few days since, he informed us that during one spring the range in his section was covered with this same wild wheat, and that cattle were never known to fatten so rapidly as during that season.
