Died, at his home in Bucklin at about three o'clock p. m., August the 2nd, 1908, Elijah Whipple, aged 73 years, 3 months and nineteen days. The funeral services were held at the M. E. church conducted by Rev. C. E. Williams and interment took place in the Bucklin cemetery. Elijah Whipple and his wife had been living on a ranch south of Bucklin in Clark county for the past twenty years until about a year ago when, his health having failed to such an extent that he could not look after the work on the ranch, they moved to Bucklin, thinking that by laying aside all care that his health might improve. But the hope was vain. Since coming here he has been gradually declining day by day until last Sunday he quietly passed to the other shore. Mr. and Mrs. Whipple never had any children of their own, they have an adopted daughter, Mrs. Hamilton of Hutchinson. She and her husband were with him at the time of his death. He leaves a devoted wife, seventy years old, to travel the remainder of life's journey alone.
The primary at Bucklin was a very quiet affair and the vote was light. A few months ago the dear people were howling for a special session of the

legislature to pass a Primary law. Well they got what they thought they wanted at considerable cost, do they use it? Judging from the vote cast here, we would say, not to any very great extent. The result here, so far as we have been able to learn at this time is about as follows, viz. Long and Bristow, 25 votes each, Leland 17, Stubbs 30, Preston 20, Finley 25. Hayes, 39, Bodfield 8, Chambliss 6 majority over Smith, Vadi son 30 votes. On the Democratic ticket for governor Ryan led by about two to one over his opponents. There was one Socialist vote cast. It would seem from the vote cast here Tuesday, that while the body of the populist party may be dead, the spirit still lives and is abroad in the land.
