C., is published for the information and guidance of all concerned: Circular No. 25. WAR DEPT. PRO. MAR. GEN.'S OFFICE, Washington, June 26, 1864. Persons not fit for military duty, and not liable to draft, from age or other causes, have expressed a desire to be personally represented in the army, in addition to the contributions they have made in the way of bounties, they propose to procure at their own expense, and present for enlistment, recruits to represent them in the service. Such practical patriotism is worthy of special commendation and encouragement. Provost Marshals and all other officers acting under this Bureau are ordered to furnish all the facilities in their power to enlist and muster promptly the acceptable representative recruits presented in accordance with the design herein set forth. The name of the person whom the recruit represents will be noted on the enlistment and descriptive roll of the recruit, and will be carried forward from those papers to the other official records which form his military history. Suitably prepared certificates of this personal representation in the service will be forwarded from this office to be filled out and issued by Provost Marshals to the persons who put in representative recruits.
