[Special Correspondence to Morning Journal] Roswell, N. M., Sept. 24.—E. C. Forney, traveling salesman for the Topoka Woolen mills, living on the Archuleta ranch in the Estancia valley, last night announced himself as an insurgent candidate for senator from the new state of New Mexico.

The county commissioners have accepted the road constructed by J. H. Forrest and some across the Mesquero mountains, from Roswell, N. M., to the Texas plains, and yesterday paid off the contractors.

Josh Crawford, aged 85 years, died last night of old age at the home of one of his seven sons, being one of the oldest citizens of the Pecos valley. CARLSBAD LOSES A PIONEER

S. T. Bitting for Twenty Years Prominent as Business Man and Official in Pecos Valley.

[Special Correspondence to Morning Journal] Carlsbad, N. M., Sept. 24.—S. T. Bitting, who passed away on Monday, was one of the pioneers of Carlsbad. Born in the east, he came west early in the '50s and established himself as a merchant in California, later entering into business in Texas. About twenty years ago he came to Carlsbad, then called Eddy. In the course of a few years he built up a large business, including dry goods, hardware, and groceries. He took a very active interest in all public affairs. He served the county as treasurer for a number of years. He was also a director of the National National bank. Later he established the S. T. Bitting bank of Carlsbad, now the National bank of Carlsbad. When the United States took over the Carlsbad project Mr. Bitting became a director and officer of the Water Users' association. He had undoubted faith in the future of the Carlsbad country and became heavily interested in cattle and farm lands, owing to falling health he gradually withdrew from active business life, retaining only his cattle and the farm. By his fair dealing and his remarkable loyalty to friends, he surrounded himself by a host of friends, not only at home, but through the entire southwest.
