RED CROSS TOLD OF PLAN TO KEEP GUARDS IN CAMP

Maj. B. Ruppe informs Society of Progress Toward Building Recreation Hall for New Mexico Soldiers.

Maj. B. Ruppe, First New Mexico infantry, last night told the Albuquerque chapter of the Red Cross society of the recreation hall planned for New Mexico troops on border guard duty. The hall will keep the young soldiers away from Columbus, N. M., where, according to Major Ruppe, there is bootlegging.

Plans provide for a building forty eight feet in floor dimensions, said Major Ruppe. The place may be used as a dance hall. A piano will be placed in the building. The segment already had a phonograph, which a Boston woman sent to Massachusetts for the "boys on the border." When the Massachusetts troops were recalled they turned the phonograph over to the New Mexicans.

The phonograph is not all the New Mexican troops have for the recreation hall. Several contributions have been made by politicians and wealthy citizens of New Mexico, according to Major Ruppe. He told the society that women of Santa Fe had held a tag day for the recreation hall.

Socty Elects Officers.

Mrs. George Knowles said the society had much work outlined but no money. The society needed more money and new members, said she. She urged every member to bring new members into the organization. She advised other societies to help, saying the Red Cross must prepare for an emergency before it arose.
