The Destruction of Jackson-ville. [Correspondence N. Y. Tribune.] JACE-SONVILLE, Fla., March 23, 18:3.

[Correspondence N. Y. Tribune.]

Jacksonville is in ruins. That beautiful city, which has been for so many years the favorite resort for invalids fram the Navit, has to-day been burned to the ground, and, what is sad to record, by the soldlers of the National army. Scarcely a mansion, a cottage, a negro hut, or a warehouse remains. The long lines of magnificent oaks, green and beautiful, with the thicket foliage, the orange groves perfuming the air with their blossoms, the sycamores, the old century plants adorning every garden, the palmetto and bayone trees, ever tropical in verdure, the rose and the jessamine—all that at this scason, indeed, I might say through all seasons, has made Jacksonville a little Eden, has been burned, and scorched, and crisped, if not entirely consumed to ashes, by the devouring fames.

Lam now writing on the deck of the fine transport ship, the Boston. Three gunboats—the Paul Jones, the Norwich, and the John Adams—are lying out in the river, with guns shotted, ready to fire the moment a rebel appears in sight. The transport vessels—the Boston, the Delavan, the Gen. Meigs, the Tillie, and the Cossack—are at the wharves, filled with troops. All are on board, except about 200 of the 6th Connecticut; who are on picket duty. Three blank shots from the Paul Jones have just been fired, as a signal for them to come in.

From this upper deek the scene presented to the spectator is one of the most fearful magnificence. On every side, from every quarter of the city, dense clouds of black smoke and flame are bursting through the mansions and warehouses. A line south wind is blowing immense blazing cinders right into the heart of the city. The beautiful Syanish moss, drooping so gracefully from the long avenues of splendid old oaks has caught fire, and as far as the eye can reach through these once pleasant streets, nothing but sheets of flame can be seen running up with the rapidity of lightning to the tops of the trees and then darting off to the smallest branches.

The whole city, mansions, warehouses, trees, shrubbery, and orange groves; all that refined taste and art through many years have made beautiful and attractive, are being lapped up and devoured by this howling flery blast. One solitary woman, a horse tied to a fence between two fires, and a lean, half-starved dog, are the only living inhabitants to be seen on the streets. Fifty families, most of them professing Union centiments, have been taken on board of the transports and provided with such accommodations as the tubs will afford. I send a list herewith. Some of them have been able to cave a bed and a few chairs, but most of them have nothing in the world but the clothes upon their backs.

Yesterday the beautiful little cottage used as the Catholic parsonage, together with the church, was fired by some of the soldiers, and in a short time burned to the ground. Before the flames had fairly reached the church the soldiers burst open the doors and commenced sacking it of everything of value. The organ was in a moment forn to strips, and almost every soldier who came out seemed to be cel-chrating the occasion by blowing through an organ pipe.

To-day the same scene was repeated, only upon a much grander scale. There must have been some understanding among the incendiaries with regard to the conflagration. At 8 o'clock the flames burst from several buildings in different parts of the city, and at a later hour still more were fired. The wind then rise to a stiff gale, and the torch of the incendiary became unnecessary to increase the fire. The only mansions of any value left stand-ing as we move down the river, are the elegant mansions of Col. Sanderson and Judge Bar-ritt, both rebels and scoundrels of the deep-ost dre.

Experiments on Iron Targets. Experiments on Iron Targets. In the London papers of the 4th ultimo, we find reports of further experiments made in firing at iron targets, with Whitworth and Armstrong projectiles. The target used, which is known as Captain Inglis shield, consisted of double slabs of wrought-iron, placed transversely, with an embrasure in the center. To the left of this they were eight and five inches thick respectively, and to the right seven and five inches; the whole being bolted on to an iron backing by massive bolts, and supported by wrought-iron struts. The number of shots fired at it was only seven, in consequence of the difficulty in obtaining clear sea room. sea room.

The first was from a Whitworth 7-inch muz-

sea room.

The first was from a Whitworth 7-inch muzzle-loading rifle-gun, throwing a 120-pound shot. This was loaded with 25 pounds of powder, and a flat-headed, hardened projectile. On striking the left side of the target, it emitted a sheet of flame, the head of the shot burying itself in the metal, and the remainder breaking into fragments. It is supposed to have made an indention four or five inches in depth. The next shot was from an Armstrong gun, which was a smooth-bored, 100 pounder, naving the same charge of powder, and spherical ball, with a velocity of 1,469 feet per second, while the Whitworth was only 1,240. This shot made a circular dent about 2 1 2 inches deep, cracked one of the inner plates, knocked off a boil head, and shook the whole target quite roughly, but not sufficiently so to damage it for furure service.

Number three was from a 300-pounder Armstrong gun, rifled on what is called the dunt principle—that is to say, though the shot enters castly by the muzzle down one series of grooves, it is shunted into another series, along which it passes when discharged. The ball was 19 1-2 inches in length and weighed 300 pounds, having a charge of 45 pounds of powder, which sent it with a velocity of 1,450 teet per second, shook the target, eracked an outer plate; but otherwise inilited no damage.

The fourth trial was made with what is called the Thomas gun, which is rified on a peculiar principle. The weight of metal thrown, was 151 pounds of wrought iron, with 25 pounds of powder. The ball on striking,

doubled up like a cauliflower, after making an indention like the 100-pounder. Another Whitworth was then fired, without producing effects worth mentioning. The large Armstrong gun was next brought to bear, with a solid shot of 306 pounds, and a charge of 45 pounds. The missile injured the target consideraby, and sent its fragments of cast-iron flying through the air with a tremendous roar. Some of the outer plates were broken in fresh places, and several boits were broken or dislotged. How long the victory would have remained with the target, had the firing been kept un, can not be allirmed; but so far it was complete, only the outer skin having sufferd from the heaviest artillery that could be brought to bear upon it. Events shortly to take place on our Southern coast will however, afford a much more reliable practical test of iron armor than any number of trials upon stationary targets.
