The chiefs of the police and fire departments have prepared reports showing the work performed by these departments during 1899. Both are worthy of an analytical inspection.

During the year there were 2,795 arrests or an average of a fraction less than eight a day for each day in the year. This might be taken to indicate that Butte is a very lawless city, but such an inference would not be entirely correct. As a matter of fact, it is but the natural result of the employment of large numbers of men, the large majority of whom are single, at good wages, for in any community where comany men earn the money that laborers carn in Butte there is bound to be more drinking done than there would be in a community where money dependently is less free, and when men get drunk they are likely to commit petty of the arrests were for offenses of this character.
