The whole state is thoroughly alarmed at the possibility of a shutdown of the Butte mines in case the federal government should enjoin the Washoe smelter at Anaconda to prewent the destruction of timber in the government reserve by smelter fumes. There is irony in the fact that the Amalgamated company sought to have the reserve extended to embrace the timber which it is now charged with destroying. No haste has been shown by President Roosevelt thus far in dealing with the situation. His action in ordering an investiga tion was fair and conservative, and as the case is in process of adjudication in the United States court, it is entirely improbable that the government will take the summary action that is feared by the people of Butte. The continued operation of the mines. upon which thousands of toilers are dependent, is much more essential to Montana than the preservation of a few trees that may be endangered by the smelter smoke. The Bitter Root is industrially independent of Butte and Anaconda. All the towns of the state, however, are interdependent in a way, and we desire to see all sections as prosperous and contented as is this.
