LARGEST CYRCULATION:

Our dispatches this morning are of more then usual interest. The fighting in Tensees is universally favorable to our troops, and the information from Sherman leaves but little doubt but that Savannah must fall, if it has not already done so.

## Recruiting.

In anticipation of another draft, pearly all the cities of the State are engaged in procuring recruits, that the demand upon them may be filled in advance. In most cases large bounties are being paid, and good recruits are obtained, as a consequence.

AFFAIRS are still unchanged at Nashville Both armies are building works, and, as yet, neither seems inclined to attack. The Fedoral lines stretch in a semi-circle around the city, the wings resting on the Cumberland above and below, with a distance of six miles between the two points of contact with the river. The rebel army stretches in front of and parallel with ours, at a distance of eight hundred yards, but without touching the river on either flank. The fact that Hood has not already attacked Nashville seems conclusive against the probability of his attacking it at all. Even if he could break through our present line two miles south of the city, he would have to march across a plain, and force the passage of the Cumberland, in the face of a fire ville stands. Desperate and rash as he is, he will not dare attempt such a movement as this. He may have designed crossing the Cumberland above Nashville and advancing into Kentucky, forcing Thomas to follow with the whole, or the larger part of his army, or his object may be to keep the garrison at Chattanooga in its present isolation until the failure of its supplies shall force it to evacuate the place and retire to Knozville The problem is one of much interest an importance. Hood's army is badly clad and provisioned for a movement in any direction, during the present cold weather. His delay in front of Nashville, has enabled Thomas to concentrate any army superior to his own in every respect, and just as soon as the weather will admit of a movement, the hero of Chicamanga will force Hood to battle, with all the advantages against the rebei General. A few days more will doubtless determine the prospects of the eampaign is clearly on the Federal side. ---


