Winter in Italy—A Warning to Invalids.

The following letter appears in the Tribune:

The rainy season of Italy is in the Winter months, and an old resident assures me that sometimes they have only twelve bright sunny days in the season, in cities whose streets are narrow and buildings lofty, a rain day brings wet and chilly streets for several days thereafter.

On the 14th of November last, I rode into the Bologna in as thick a snow storm as I ever saw in New England.

This was to me the winding-up of a three days' Northeast rain storm in Venice. We had so many rainy and cloudy days in December, that I began to take note of the weather with the beginning of the new year.

In January we had only twelve bright sunny days; in February sixteen, and in the first nine days of March two.

On the 25th of February we had a heavy fall of snow which was carried from the streets the next day. In that month the ice in the still waters of the Arno, just above one of the bridges, was four inches thick.

February was a cold month. All the Winter long the wind has been Northeasterly, coming to us over the snow-clad heights of the Apennines.

Anyone who has had experience in Italian cities knows that passing from bright sunshine into narrow shady streets is like going into an ice house on a hot Summer day.

I cannot conceive of a more trying climate for an invalid than this Italy. If a medical man of New York should send a patient to Boston to spend the month of March, he would be regarded as insane; but an average March in that city is more favorable to an invalid than our last January in Florence was.

The weather during the last Winter in Vienna, Milan, Rome and Naples has been as unfriendly to the invalid as it has been in this city.

Indeed, there is no place in Europe that is a suitable Winter resort for invalids, and whenever crosses the Atlantic in quest of such a resort, makes a grave mistake.

I am inclined to think that Americans have a false impression as to the climate of "sunny Italy," and if this brief note acts as a caution to any suffering invalid who is proposing to try the climate, my object will be accomplished.
