THE POSTAL STRIKE IN PARIS.

The postal strike in Paris is now practically dead. The government officials announce that only 400 men are out, and these were expected to return this morning. At a meeting last night 3,000 postal employees listened to violent harangues from the labor leaders, who prophesied that grave events would happen today in the direction of action by the outside unions. A resolution was adopted that the struggle be continued to a finish.

Two other meetings under the auspices of organized union syndicates were characterized by revolutionary speeches, in which it was declared that the "the workmen's 1792 is at hand."
M. Patard, the electricians' leader, evoked enthusiasm when he recommended the overthrow of the existing regime. One of the speakers, however, admitted that many unions were not ready to strike and the assemblies broke up after adopting resolutions proclaiming the solidarity of the strike employees. The desperation of the strike leaders is evidenced by the fact that destructive measures are now being carried out, following threats recently made.

A gang in an automobile yesterday cut 30 of the chief out going cables at various points on the outskirts of Paris. There have been several cases of wire cutting in the provinces. Oil and other fluids have been poured into the letter-boxes and in one instance the oil was set on fire, many letters being destroyed.
