THE OVERFLOW OF THE SEINE

There has been no abatement of the flood from the river Seine, which still continues to rise. The gauge at Pont Royal last night marks a height of 5.93 meters, which is 3.45 meters above the normal and somewhat higher than that estimated a few days ago for this date.

The low quarters at the eastern end of Paris and part of the Museum of Natural History are now inundated and the subterranean passages to the Austerlitz station are flooded, gangways being improvised for passengers. The cellars of the Palais de Justice, the conciergerie and the prefecture of police are full of water.

The suburbs of Paris are suffering immense damage. The river at Asnieres is over its banks, flooding the lower floors of houses. The poor in the eastern suburbs who were so heartily stricken last January, are again suffering almost as severely.

Congressman William W. Fouldrod, of the Fifth Pennsylvania district, died at his home in Philadelphia without knowing the result of last Tuesday's election, when he was defeated by Michael Donohue for re-election.
