OVERRIDES VETO

Prohibition Enforcement Bill Sustained by House—Senate Claimed, Will do Likewise.

President Wilson yesterday vetoed the prohibition enforcement bill. His action does not change the existing situation in any untoward degree save in those States, cities and communities where a court ruling has already legalized the sale of 2.75 per cent alcoholic beverages. The sale of these may be continued. Had the prohibition act become a law, however, severe penalties would be imposed on anyone selling liquids containing more than one half of 1 per cent of alcohol.

At 5:15 o'clock with the time of adjournment near the President's veto message was read to the House. Barely two hours later the House in a hold over session voted decisively to override the veto, although a parliamentary tangle threatened to defer action on the measure until Thursday.

The vote in the House was 176 to 55, with two members voting present. Action in the Senate will come later in the week. There is no question but that its vote to override the veto will be as equally decisive, so the President's action will merely have served to stay the enforcement of the bill.

MICHIGAN BANS OLIVES

Action Follows Poisoning of Five Persons

Detroit, Oct. 28.—Seizure of all ripe olives in the stocks of local retail stores was begun yesterday, because of the deaths of five persons who attended a dinner last week at which the fruit was served. Chemical analysis showed the olives contained poisonous bacilli.

Nine thousand bottles of the ripe fruit were taken in early seizures and wholesalers were ordered to discontinue sale of both ripe and green olives, while hotels were advised to strike olives from their menus.

Department of Health physicians today decided to ask a ban on the sale of olives throughout Michigan. Samples of other canned and bottled foods are being analyzed.

GOVERNOR SUSPENDS MAYOR.

Columbus, Ohio, Oct. 28.—Governor Cox yesterday suspended Mayor Poorman, of Caton, following a hearing on the steel strike rioting in that city. Cox threatened Poorman with suspension Saturday when the Ohio National Guard was mobilized to cope with the situation.

It was alleged Poorman did not exercise sufficient restrictive measures.

Soon after breakfast the President asked Dr. Grayson that Secretary Tumulty be called and that some pardon cases, which were awaiting executive action, be given him. He acted on the latter at once, and also signed some minor bills that had accumulated at the White House during the past few days.
