WASHINGTON NEWS

Senator Colquitt, of Georgia, who has been lying at the point of death, is slightly improved.

Congressman Childs has been instructed to report favorably a bill for a new district federal judge for Chicago.

It has been decided by the house agricultural committee to report favorably Hatch's anti-option bill as amended.

Secretary Gresham charges Great Britain with dereliction in presenting legislation concerning the Bering sea dispute.

Chicago merchants say they can successfully compete with New York in furnishing Indian supplies for the government.

The Boatner resolution to take the Union Pacific railroad litigation out of the hands of the department of justice and to prosecute it by special counsel still rests with the committee on judiciary, but Chairman Reilly of the house committee on Pacific railroads says he is confident of securing control of the resolution when the question is again called up.

IMPORTANT LAND CASE.

In the case of the state of Washington against John G. McBride, which is, perhaps, the most important case ever before the general land office, the controversy being over a mineral placer claim adjoining Tacoma valued at between \$3,000,000 and \$4,000,000, Secretary Smith held that a hearing is necessary to determine the value and extent of the alleged deposits, and orders a thorough prospecting of the land.

CLEVELAND HAS SEIGNIORAGE BILL. Chairman Pearson of the house committee on enrolled bills presented the Bland silver seigniorage bill to Private Secretary Thurber, who receipted for it in the president's name Monday afternoon. The constitutional ten days' limitation within which it must be signed or vetoed if at all did not begin to run until Tuesday, however, as fractions of days are not counted. Very speedy action on the part of the president is not expected.

TO INCREASE THE VETO POWER.

Representative De Armond of Missouri has introduced in the house a resolution amending the constitution so as to empower the president to veto any one or more items of an appropriation bill. It is well known that frequently the chief executive finds provisions on these bills that are objectionable to him, yet rather than sacrifice the numerous items which would result from a veto he signs the bills and they become laws as a whole.

RESTRICTION OF IMMIGRATION.

The house committee on immigration has under consideration and will probably report with a favorable indorsement a bill for the restriction of immigration, introduced by Representative Curtis of Kansas. It provides both an educational and property qualification and requires that every immigrant admitted to the United States over 15 years of age must be able to read and write his native language. In addition to this every head of a family must have at least \$500 in cash, every single man \$300 and every single woman \$100.

NEW PENSION MEASURE.

The house committee on invalid pensions is devoting some attention to a bill which makes it unlawful for any person willfully to communicate or cause to be communicated to United States officials performing duties connected with pensions any false statement with intent thereby to defeat or suspend the granting or payment of pensions to any pensioner or applicant. The bill was introduced by Chairman Martin.

COLLECTING PACIFIC RAILROAD DEBTS.

Representative Reilly of Pennsylvania, chairman of the house committee on Pacific railroads, says that he considers the collection of the government debt from the various Pacific roads one of the most important questions now before congress, not excepting the tariff and finance issues. The amount involved is about \$135,000,000. Some action is absolutely necessary. The committee on Pacific railroads is considering various measures and will have hearings by all parties interested.

INCREASE IN GOLD PRODUCTION.

Production of gold throughout the world of \$150,000,000 for the calendar year 1893 is the latest estimate of the bureau of the mint. The gold production of 1892, as revised in the last report of the mint bureau, was \$138,961,000. The increase of \$11,000,000 will be mainly furnished by the United States, South Africa and Russia. The figures for the United States indicate an increase of \$4,000,000 over those for 1892, the increase in South Africa will be about \$6,000,000, in Russia about half a million, and in Australia also about half a million.


