apples for \$18,000. The yield of Judge Wellhouse's orchards was about 33,000 bushels -5000 bushes more than he expected The judge sold to one firm in New York 5000 barrels of his first grade apples, receiving therefor \$12,500

-\$2.50 a barrell. Judge Wellhouse doesnt' know how many apple trees he has, but is sure the number is greater than 100,000. His orchards extend over 1600 acres of ground. They are in Leavenworth and Osage counties. -Topeka Kas. Daily Herald.
