But the fatal hour drew near that was to try her, and teach a group of sorrowing friends and relatives, the importance of being ready. To her Pastor who saw her but a few hours before her exit, she said with much earnestness, "I ought to have attended to these things before when I was well." Again on being urged to take hold of and trust in the Savior, she responded, "I fear it is too late," yet after religious exercise her mind became more calm, and she seemed to lay hold by faith on the hope set before her, though with a trembling hand, and said "I hope God's blessing will be upou me" -and immediately expressed an earnest wish for the salvation of her friends.
