TUCKER THEATRE RE- DUCES ADMISSION PRICES

Beginning next Friday, November 18th, The Tucker places in effect a big cut in its regular admission prices. The balcony is reduced from 25c to 15c, and the loges from 35c to 25c, the main floor remaining the same, 25c, including tax.

While the cost of the pictures have not decreased in the least, in fact, they are higher today than ever, Mr. Tucker feels that the increased patronage will well justify the reduction.
