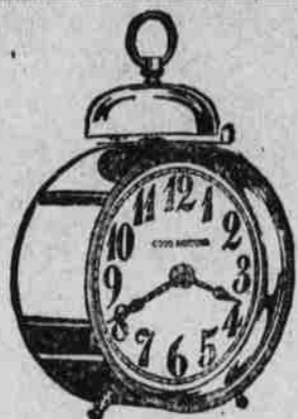
COOPER-WHITE
