Ordinance No. 38. (Published April 19, 1888.) An Ordinance fixing times of regular

of the City Board.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the city of Colby, Thomas counts, and state of Kansas:

Sec. 1. That section one(1) of ordinance number two(5) be amended, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: That regular meetings of the board of city councilmen shall be held on the first Tuesday night of each month, at he hours specified as follows, to-wit: In the months of June, July and August at eight o clock p. m. In September, October, November, March, April and May at seven and one-half o'clock p. m. In

December, January and February at the hour of seven o'clock p. m. Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinanes inconsistent herewith are hereby repeal-

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its publication once in the Phomas County Cat.

An Ordinance to amend section one:1) of ordi-dance number twent,-five(25), relating to pool and billiard tables. Be it Ordained by the mayor and councilen of the city of Colby:

Sec. 1. That section ove(1) of ordinance number twenty-five(25), entitled an ordinance to amend section two(2) of ordinance number three(3), relating to pool and billiard tables, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: All applicati na for license under this ordinance shall be by petition in oity of Colby, stating the name of the person or persons applying for the same, and des-cribing the proposed place of business, and the applicant or applicants shall at the same time file in the office of thecity cierk his or their bond to the city of Colby in the pena sum of Three Hundred Dollars, with sufficient sureties to be approved by the city council-nen, conditioned that he or they will keep an men, conditioned that he or they will keep an orderly house, and will not permit any unlawful gaming, drunkenness, quarreling or other disorderly conduct therein, or, in any premises connected therewith, or thereunto belonging, nor permit or suffer any minor under the age of eighteen years, or apprentice to play therein on any billiard, pool or pigeon hole table in or about such premises without a permission from the parent, guardian or mage or mistress of such minor or apprentice. such application be granted and such bond such application be granted and such bond be approved, the applicant or applicance shaft pay into the city treasurer for the use of the city of Colby, the sum of Tweoty-five Tollars (25.00) for the first table, and if there he more than one table, whether the same be a billiard, pool or pigeon hole table, such applicant shaft pay into said city treasurer for the use of said city. Ten Dollars (30.0) for each such other table in the billiard half or house kept, run or used, or to be kept, run or used by such aptable in the billiars and or used by such ap-used, or to be kept, run or used by such ap-alleant, as specified in section one; i) of this plicant, as specified in section one; i) of this ordinance, and upon the presentation of the city treasurer's receipts for the sem or surs as aforestid, the city elerk shall issue a license

to such applicant or applicants according to prayer of petition granted for the municipal Sec. 2. No billiard hall or house shall allow any game or games of billiards, pool, pin-pool, ball pool, negro billiards, or piecon hole, or ne by whatsoever name celled, to be any game by whatsoever name called, to be played on any table within such hall or house between the hours of 11 o'clock p. m. and 6. o'clock a. m., and such hall or house shall be closed between said hours on each and every week night. No billiard hall or house shall be open for business or public enterthinment on that day of the week exist Sunday, our shall the owner or ownerstor proprietor or proprie-tors of any billiard hall or house permit any game to be played by anyone of a y talle or tables in his or their hall or house on a id day

Sec. 2. A violation of any of the foregoing provisions shall be purez sed by a fire of not less than ten dollars and not more than one hundred dollars, and by forfeiture of any license granted hereusder.

Soc. 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repeated.

Soc. 5. This ordinance shall be to full form and effect after its publication once in the Thomas county Cat.
