PREDICT DAIL SOON APPROVE ANGELO TREATY

London, Dec. 29.—A majority of newspaper correspondents in Ireland see a growing volume of sentiment in favor of early ratification of the Anglo-Irish peace treaty, and indications are it will be approved soon after the Dail Eireann, the Sinn Fein parliament, is reconvened on Saturday for further consideration of the pact.

DEATH CHAIR READY FOR NEGRO SLAYER

Little Rock, Dec. 29.—John Henry Price, negro, convicted of the murder of F. C. Moody, dairy man at Helena, will be electrocuted Friday morning at sunrise unless Governor McRae intervenes and grants a stay. Warden Dempsey at "The Walls" announced the time of Price's execution.

Price was employed by Moody and the killing is said to have resulted from a quarrel over wages.

WARREN, IT SEEMS, WEARIED BY OFFICE

SUES PEN BOARD ON SEED PAYMENT

Little Rock, Dec. 29.—William Brooks, local planter, late yesterday filed suit against the penitentiary commission for \$17,464, alleged due on a cotton seed contract made with the former penitentiary commission in 1919.

Mr. Brooks alleged in his complaint that the present commission refused to honor his claim for the alleged indebtedness although it had been approved by the former commission.

ARKANSAS CITIES HAVE GASLESS DAY

Little Rock, Dec. 29.—Mains of the Arkansas Natural Gas Company are broken near Hope, and Little Rock, Pine Bluff, Hot Springs, Arkadelphia and other cities in Arkansas will be without gas until 10 o'clock tonight, when it is believed repairs on the mains will be completed. The company supplies many Arkansas towns and cities north of Hope.

RAIL WAGE SLASH TO AFFECT 6,000

Nashville, Tenn., Dec. 29.—Wage reductions which will affect 6,000 employees of the Nashville, Chattanooga & St. Louis railway are proposed in a letter addressed by President Cole to all connected with the company.

PARLEY NOW AT CRUCIAL POINT, SAID

Washington, Dec. 29.—With many elements of uncertainty bedouling its future, the arms conference today entered the phase of its negotiations which will determine whether it will be successful in imposing limitations upon any class of warcraft except capital ships.

Immediate proposals now before the naval committee have to do with limitation of the tonnage of aircraft and carriers.

TAKE HARDING AS OUR JUDGE PERU TO CHILE

Lima, Peru, Dec. 29.—Peru in a new note to Chile over the dispute in regard to Tacna-Agra, suggests that President Harding of the United States be asked to act as arbitrator of all differences between the two countries, no appeal from his decision being allowed either claimant.

Peru and Chile apparently are on the verge of war over Tacna-Agra, which may be allowed the privilege of a plebiscite to determine its affiliation with one of the two countries.

CLEAR SWINDLER HELD AT MEMPHIS

Memphis, Dec. 29.—J. L. Norton of Aberdeen, S. D., today exonerated Joseph Lynch, held in jail here, as a member of the gang which he claimed swindled him out of \$5,000.

Lynch and another man are held here on charges of having swindled Ed Carter, a Virginia farmer, out of \$28,000.

ANGERED AT WIFE COMMITS MURDER

Purdue, Ind., Dec. 29.—Joseph F. Litchhart, 40, has confessed the murder of his wife, Marguerite, last Sunday and the interment of her body underneath their home. According to officers who disinterred the corpse, the woman's hands had been bound behind her back and her skull crushed. The only motive which could have prompted the husband, the police said, was his anger over the late return of his wife, who was a trained nurse. Investigation disclosed that she came home late on Saturday night before the confessed murder Sunday morning.

BIG ITALY BANK CLOSES ITS DOORS

Rome, Dec. 29.—The Banco di Sconto closed its doors today following the government's announcement of a moratorium permitting the suspension of obligations of certain corporations in Italy. The bank was closed and its obligations will be suspended to await the outcome of court proceedings.

Prince of this city, died early this morning from pneumonia, according to a wire received by Mrs. Prince today.
