STATE LOSES 2 DECISIONS IN U.S. COURT

(By the Associated Press)
Washington, Feb. 27.—The Arkansas state law, prohibiting corporations doing business in the state, from removing cases from state to federal courts was today held invalid by the supreme court.

Railroad fares within the state of Arkansas are subject to regulation by the federal government, the court held in a second decision on Arkansas cases. The court ruling deprives the Arkansas railroad commission of any authority in the fixing of intra-state rates.

KU KLUX DELIVER NOTE TO CHURCHES

Helena, Feb. 27.—The principal topic of conversation in the downtown district today was the appearance of robed and hooded figures in churches here last night. The figures stalked down the aisles to the pulpits and presented each minister with type-written messages, in which it was declared that the Ku Klux Klan stands for the Christian religions, the protection of womanhood and the supremacy of the white race, and asks for the friendship and prayers of all congregations of the church. All the messages delivered to Helena pastors were found to be identical on comparison today.

LAST TOUCHES ON ARMS PACT BY COMMITTEE

Washington, Feb. 27.—Committee consideration of the arms conference treaties was completed today when the senate foreign relations committee ordered a favorable report on the Far Eastern and Chinese tariff treaties with the reservations drafted by the Republican majority.

NEGRO LYNCHING INVOLVES OTHERS

Texarkana, Feb. 27.—One more arrest in connection with the killing of F. Norman, negro taken from the officers here on February 11, is expected today. Deputy Sheriff Gordon, who had the negro in charge, was arrested Saturday on an indictment charging conspiracy to murder.

STATE IN CIRCUIT ASSIGNED KENYON

St. Louis, Feb. 27.—William S. Kenyon of Iowa, former United States senator, arrived in St. Louis and probably will be immediately sworn in as judge of the federal district, which includes Arkansas. Judge Kenyon was recently appointed by President Harding to the bench.

RUSSIA ANXIOUS FOR ALLIED LOAN

Moscow, Feb. 27.—Instructions will be given the Russian delegation to the international economic conference at Genoa to grant all concessions demanded by the allied powers, provided that by making concessions, the soviet government can obtain loans to assist in reconstruction.

Boulogne, France, Feb. 27.—Under agreement between Premiers Poincare of France and Lloyd George of England, the international economic conference will be postponed from March 8, the date originally set, until April 10.

BUTLER ONE HOPE OF SOLVING CRIME

Los Angeles, Feb. 27.—Practically all other leads to solution of the murder of William Desmond Taylor, noted motion picture director, have failed, forcing police today to concentrate their efforts on the search for Edward Sands, secretary and butler to Taylor, who disappeared the night of the murder.

BOTH MAN, WIFE EXPECTED TO DIE

Miami, Fla., Feb. 27.—Surgeons today held little hope for the recovery of either, E. C. Frady or his wife, whom he tried to kill before attempting suicide yesterday. Three shots were fired into Mrs. Frady's body. Frady then slashed his throat with a razor. Frady was president of the Chicago branch of the Cole Motor Company.

MANY ALLEGED BROKER ENRICHED BY FRAUD

HOUSE DEBATE ON FORD BID TO OPEN SOON

Washington, Feb. 27.—Investigation of Henry Ford's offer for the purchase and lease of government power and nitrate projects at Muscle Shoals entered into its final stage today.

COTTON MARKETS DECLINE SLIGHTLY

After opening higher and advancing during the forenoon to net gains of 25 points or more, the cotton markets weakened and the close was at small net declines.

New York March and May contracts each closed 6 points net lower at 18.44 and 18.14 cents, respectively. New Orleans March also lost 6 points, closing at 17.06 cents, and May closed 8 points down at 17.05 cents. Spots in New York declined 5 points to 18.75 cents, but in New Orleans were advanced 12 points to 17.25 cents.

RULING IN PHONE CASE TO COMPANY

Amarillo, Tex., Feb. 27.—Two young women were shot and killed and a third one attacked at the home of one of the victims 30 miles east of Plainview early today. The third young woman escaped injury. A young man pursued by the officers as the alleged murderer, attempted suicide.

STATE TESTS LED BY RURAL PUPILS
