

STATE NEWS.

According to the terms of orders issued by the War department the graduations of the West Point class of cadets for this year will take place Feb. 18, instead of June 12, as has heretofore been the case.

The Wisconsin legislature is two weeks behind in its work so that the hopes of a comparatively short session seem destined not to be realized.

An important announcement is the report that Gov. La Follette will himself appear before the committee and urge the passage of the Primary Election bill.

Little progress was made in the disposition of the bills last week, the chief time evidently being given by the members to the drafting of new measures to be introduced.

The remains of Louis Ortell and Elizabeth Ortell who died of injuries received from the explosion of a lamp last Sunday night, were interred at Kenosha.

A case of smallpox was found at Marinette. Louis Brusow, a woodsman, is ill with varioloid having been vaccinated. It is a light form of the disease and regular quarantine measures have been taken.

Department Commander D. G. James and George L. Thomas, president of the Board of Trustees of the Wisconsin Veterans home left Milwaukee for Waupun to attend a meeting of the board. Commander James is making the necessary arrangements for the holding of the annual encampment at Sheboygan. The date is not settled, but it will probably be about the middle of May.
