FROM TEAGUES. Teagues Tenn. Dec. 15th 1867.

Mr. Editor: A great many of your readers are anxious to learn the history of the great "Agri. cultural Wheel." If you will allow me space in your paper, I will give your readers a brief history of the Wheel and its growth.

The first Wheel that was organized in the United States dates February the 15th, 1882, in a log school house, 8 miles South West of De sark, in Prairie county, Arkansas, with seven members. The membership in 1883, numbered over 500; in 1884 5,000 in 1885, 10, 000; in 1886, 50,000; and in 1887, 500,000. The membership in our own fair state numbers 53,600. We have 1028 Subordinate wheels in this state, besides 16 Colored wheels.
