THE REJECTION OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT BY GEORGIA.

We have heretofore mentioned the fact that the Legislature of Georgia, by a unanimous vote (36 yeas) in the Senate, and 121 to 2 in the House of Representatives, refused to ratify the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States. The committee who recommended this action accompanied their report with a lengthy argument against ratifying the amendment, the substance of which is as follows:

THE REJECTION OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT BY GEORGIA.

That Georgia was one of the original thirteen States by which the government was created, and must always have continued to bear that relation to the general government, unless she reserved to herself the right to secede or delegated to some department of the general government the right to reject her.
