

BIGGEST FLAG IN THE WORLD

Will Be Used as a Decoration When Taft Visits Memphis Next Week.

The largest flag in the world is being made and will be stretched from a one-inch wire cable that will be strung from the top of the Union and Planters' bank building to the top of the Bank of Commerce and Trust company's building. It will be hung Monday to welcome President Taft.

The flag will be 80 feet wide and 120 feet long. Each one of the thirteen stripes will be 6 feet 1 inch in width, and each of the forty-nine stars will be 5 feet from tip to tip. After Taft day the flag will be taken down and become the property of the citizens of Memphis to be used on any occasion.

Many with whom these interested have kept in touch, are known to be occupying honored and influential positions in different parts of the world, and are

prominently active in various kinds of Christian work.
