"To the Republican electors of the United Conventions of the United Co

States: 'In accordance with usage and the in-"In accordance with usage and the instructions of the Republican National Committee of 1822, and by the decision of the National Convention a national convention of delegates representatives of the Republican party will be held at the city of St. Louis, in the State of Missourt, on the 18th day of June, 1896, at 12 o'clock noon, for the purpose of nominating candiates for President and Vice-President of the United States, to be supported at the next national election, and President of the United States, to be supported at the next national election, and
for the transaction of further business,
as may be brought before it. The Republican electors in the several States
and Territories and voters, without regard to past political affiliations, who believe in Republican principles and endorse
the Republican policy, are cordially invited to unite under this call for formation for a national ticket.

THE DELEGATES.

"Each State will be entitled to four delegates at large, and for each representative in Congress at large, two delegates and each congressional district, each Territory and the District of Columbia two delegates. The delegates at large wall be chosen by popular State convenient Shall be chosen by popular State conven-tions, called on not less than twenty days publishment, and not less than thirty days before the meeting of the national

convention.

"The congressional district delegates shall be chosen at conventions called by the congressional committee of each disthe congressional committee of each dis-rict in the same manner as the nomina-tion of a representative in Congress is made in districts, provided that in any congressional district where there is no Republican convention, Republican State Committee shall appoint from the resi-dents of such districts a committee for the purpose of calling a district con-vention to elect district delegates. The Territorial delegates shall be chosen in the same manner as the nomination of the same manner as the nomination of a delegate in Congress is made. "In addition to the representatives now authorized by the rules of the national convention, for the Territories of Utah, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Arizona, the committee advises each of said four Territories to elect four delegates, and the admission of such additional delegates to the convention is refused.

"An alternate delegate for each delegate to the national convention to act in case of the absence of the delegate, shall be elected in the same manner and at the same time as the delegate is elected.

"All notices of cotness must be filed with the secretary of the national committee in writing, accompanied by printed statement of the grounds of contest, which shall be made public.
