Jumped Down Six Stories and Lives.
NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—Kate Walsh, twenty-five years old, who has no home, tried to end her life by jumping from the window of a vacant apartment on the top floor of the six story Blackburn apartments. 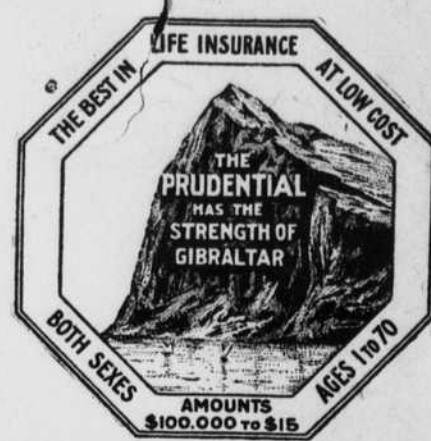
